



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# Zerotolerance

#### **Hurtful Behaviours**

- > Humiliating, distressing or insensitive
- Undermine psychological safety of victim
- Ranges from insensitive words/actions to intentional bullying to peer conflict

#### **BULLYING**

- > Repeated or persistent
- > Intent to hurt
- Victims find it difficult to stop it or stand up for themselves

#### **Examples:**

- Leaving someone out
- Expressing negative thoughts about someone (e.g. namecalling)
- Making insensitive comments about race/skin tone/religion
- Having conflicts
- Single act of joking/teasing

#### **Examples:**

- Sexual harassment
- Persistent in damaging someone else's belongings
- Repeated name-calling
- Using any digital/online platform to gossip, pass comments or threaten another

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# PSLE Achievement Levels (ALs)





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#### **Achievement Level (AL)**

- Reflects a student's individual level of achievement
- Students' AL for each subject will reflect their level of achievement, rather than how they have performed relative to their peers.

AL	RAW MARK RANGE	
1	≥ 90	
2	85 – 89	
3	80 – 84	
4	75 – 79	
5	65 – 74	
6	45 – 64	
7	20 – 44	
8	< 20	



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# Scoring for Foundation Level Subjects





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#### **Foundation Level Subject Grades**

Foundation Level AL Reflected on Result Slip	Foundation Raw Mark Range	Equivalent Standard Subject AL
Α	75 – 100	6
В	30 – 74	7
С	< 30	8

- For the purpose of S1 posting, foundation level AL A to AL C will be mapped to AL 6 to AL 8 of standard level subjects respectively, to derive a student's overall PSLE score.
- This mapping is based on the learning and assessment load of the subjects, and informs students of their readiness to access the curriculum at the secondary level.



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#### 2025 Placement

#### THREE SUITES OF SUBJECTS: G1, G2 AND G3

Students with a cumulative AL score of four to 20 will be able to take the G3 (General 3) suite of subjects — the highest level and which corresponds to the current Express stream.

Students with a score of 23 to 24 will take the G2 suite of subjects, while those with a score of 26 to 30 will take the G1 suite.

Those whose scores fall in between will be able to take a mix of subjects from G1 to G3.

#### Entering a secondary school



#### **PSLE/S1 Posting Process**

- Based on a student's PSLE score
- Most students enter secondary schools this way



#### **DSA-Sec**

- Based on a diverse range of talents and achievements in specific academic subjects or non-academic areas, beyond what the PSLE recognises
- Allows students to access school programmes to develop their talents

# What are schools looking for?

- The selection process differs across schools, and across different DSA-Sec categories.
- Generally, schools are looking for candidates with:

# Talent, passion, commitment

- Schools may look at achievements and participation (e.g. in Junior Sports Academy).
- Schools may also conduct tests, trials or selection camps to identify students with strengths, or sound fundamentals and potential, in particular areas.

#### Strong personal qualities

- Schools may look at CCA records and VIA participation.
- Schools may also conduct interviews.

#### Good academic fit

 Schools may look at primary school results to ensure students can benefit from the school's pace of learning.





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# Absence – during exams & weighted assessments

- If your child is unwell, please let your child rest at home.
- Submit **medical certificate** when he/she comes back to school.
  - Only MCs are accepted to account for absence during exams

#### School Absences

If your child is absent from school due to medical or compassionate reasons, you are required to provide the form teachers with a medical certificate or letter. If it is not approved, the absence will be considered as absent without valid reasons. In the event that there is a weighted assessment or examination, students who are absent for the paper without valid reasons will be given 0 mark for the paper.

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### Direct School Admission (DSA)

Does the school provide any guidance for students who are interested to apply through DSA?

- The DSA scheme allows students to secure early placements in their desired secondary schools based on their talents and achievements before taking the PSLE.
- Your child's PSLE score still matters. Students offered placement in a DSA-Sec school still need a PSLE score that qualifies them for the Posting Group offered by the school.
- Your child can discuss with his/her CCA teachers for DSA.



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# Wearing of Smart-watches and devices

Are students prohibited from wearing smartwatches? As many parents are working, these devices facilitate tracking and communication with their children, potentially reducing the reliance on mobile phones.
