## What are hurtful behaviours and bullying?

In Singapore, local studies show that verbal/social bullying forms the bulk of the types of bullying experienced in schools and they often start as 'harmless teasing' or leaving someone out but escalate into bullying.



Hence, **we need to take a serious view of all forms of hurtful behaviours and bullying**, starting from once-off insensitive remarks before they become normalised or escalated.

### Hurtful behaviours

Unkind and hurtful acts that include insensitive words/actions, even physical violence.

### Bullying

Happens when a person behaves in a way that hurts someone **repeatedly and on purpose**

## Examples of Hurtful Behaviours

### Physical

Hitting someone or damaging someone's belongings, tends to occur alongside other forms of hurtful behaviours. It can extend from offline to online platforms, amplifying its visibility.

### Social

Leaving someone out of a group or things on purpose.

### Verbal

Name-calling, spreading rumours or making threats.

*Multiple forms could be experienced by the same student at the same time or sequentially.*

### Cyber

Occurs when online technology (e.g. mobile phones, computers or social media) is used as a means to hurt or upset someone on purpose and repeatedly (through sharing and/or resurfacing a post).

*Some common forms of cyber bullying include flaming, harassment, cyber stalking, denigration, impersonation, exclusion, trickery and doxxing.*

## What can parents do when their child encounters a bullying incident?

### If your child is bullied

**Remain calm** to assess the situation and provide emotional support to your child.

Have a conversation with them using **C.H.E.E.R.** as a guide to understand what they are experiencing.

- **C**alm them down. Speak in a gentle tone.
- **H**ear them out. Lend them a listening ear.
- **E**mpathise with and acknowledge their feelings.
- **E**ncourage them to seek help.
- **R**eassure them that you will always be there to support them and listen to their problems.

- Reflects a student's individual level of achievement
- Students' AL for each subject will reflect their level of achievement, rather than how they have performed relative to their peers.

Foundation Level AL Reflected on Result Slip	Foundation Raw Mark Range	Equivalent Standard Subject AL
A	75 – 100	6

- For the purpose of S1 posting, foundation level AL A to AL C will be mapped to AL 6 to AL 8 of standard level subjects respectively, to derive a student's overall PSLE score.
- This mapping is based on the learning and assessment load of the subjects, and informs students of their readiness to access the curriculum at the secondary level.

## 2026 Placement

**THREE SUITES OF SUBJECTS: G1, G2 AND G3**

Students with a cumulative AL score of four to 20 will be able to take the G3 (General 3) suite of subjects – the highest level and which corresponds to the current Express stream.

Students with a score of 23 to 24 will take the G2 suite of subjects, while those with a score of 26 to 30 will take the G1 suite.

Those whose scores fall in between will be able to take a mix of subjects from G1 to G3.

## *How Do I Pass PSLE under the new AL System?*

- The PSLE is a useful checkpoint to gauge a child's understanding of key concepts and academic strengths.
- It is also a placement exam to determine the most appropriate course and subject level for a student, based on the student's educational needs at the point of entry to secondary school.

Foundation Students require **a B** or better in EL and MA

## *How Do I Pass PSLE under the new AL System?*

- Students who are not eligible for any of the Posting Groups would be offered the option to repeat the PSLE, or progress to NorthLight School or Assumption Pathway School
- **When repetition might be considered:**
  - If a student's PSLE results do not meet the minimum requirements for any secondary school placement
  - In exceptional circumstances where parents and schools agree it would benefit the student's academic development
  - The Ministry of Education generally aims to place all students in appropriate secondary school programs rather than requiring PSLE repetition, as the system is designed with multiple pathways to accommodate different learning abilities and paces.

## WHAT IS FULL SBB?

- Full SBB will be implemented in secondary schools from 2024, and aims for students to:



Have greater ownership of their learning according to their strengths, interests, abilities, talents and learning needs.



Develop a growth mindset and an intrinsic motivation to learn for life.



Have more opportunities to interact with friends of different strengths, interests, abilities and talents.



Have more options for post-sec pathways, while ensuring they have strong fundamentals and can thrive in their chosen pathway.



## OFFERING SUBJECTS AT A MORE DEMANDING LEVEL AT THE START OF SEC 1

- Students posted to schools through PG1 and PG2 can offer **English Language, Mother Tongue Languages, Mathematics and Science** at a more demanding level based on their PSLE AL for each subject.

## OFFERING SUBJECTS AT A LESS DEMANDING LEVEL AT THE START OF S1

- For students who offered **English Language, Mathematics and/or Science** at Foundation level at PSLE, but are otherwise eligible to take most of their subjects at G3 when entering secondary school, they may choose to take these subjects at a less demanding level (LDL; i.e., G2), in consultation with their secondary schools.
- Students have the option to offer **Mother Tongue Languages (MTL)** at LDL based on their PSLE Achievement Level (AL) for the subject:

POSTING GROUP (PG)	PSLE AL FOR MTL <sup>^</sup>	OPTION TO OFFER MTL AT A LESS DEMANDING LEVEL
PG3	AL 6	G2
	AL 7-8	G1 or G2
PG2	AL 7-8	G1

<sup>^</sup> Foundation level AL A to AL C will be mapped to AL 6 to AL 8 of Standard level subjects respectively.

- Students who are eligible to offer MTL at LDL can still choose to offer MTL at-level if they prefer.

## ***What is Direct school admission (DSA)?***

- Direct School Admission for Secondary Schools (DSA-Sec)
- Provides an alternative pathway to secondary school admission
- Selection based on students' interests, aptitude and potential, beyond PSLE results
- Requires students to commit to the chosen school and program



# GREENRIDGE PRIMARY SCHOOL

## ***Key Considerations of DSA***

- Students admitted via DSA-Sec: Cannot participate in the Secondary 1 posting exercise
- Cannot transfer to another school
- Must remain in the school for the duration of the program
- Parents should consider: Child's strengths and interests, School's programs and talent development support
- Schools and programs can be explored via SchoolFinder

## ***Eligibility and Application Process***

- Open to Primary 6 students
- Areas of talents : Sports, arts, debate, STEM, languages, uniformed groups and leadership
- Application via DSA-Sec Portal (no application fees)
- Assistant Year Head Primary 6 will send out an announcement via Parent Gateway when applications for DSA open.

## Allocation Outcomes


- Your child's DSA-Sec allocation results will be released along with the PSLE results. Collect the results at your child's primary school.
- There are 2 possible allocation outcomes: **successful** or **unsuccessful**.
- If your child is admitted to a secondary school through DSA-Sec, they are **not** allowed to submit school choices during S1 Posting, nor transfer to another school. They are required to honor their commitment to the posted DSA-Sec school for the duration of the program.
- Your child will receive an Eligibility Letter enclosed with their PSLE results if this applies to your child. You must submit these options by the last day of S1 school choice submission period.

## DSA-SEC SELECTION

# What are schools looking for?

- The selection process differs across schools, and across different DSA-Sec categories.
- Generally, schools are looking for candidates with:

### Talent, passion, commitment

- Schools may look at **achievements and participation** (e.g. in Junior Sports Academy).
- Schools may also conduct tests, trials or selection camps to identify students with **strengths, or sound fundamentals and potential**, in particular areas.

### Strong personal qualities

- Schools may look at CCA records and VIA participation.
- Schools may also conduct interviews.

### Good academic fit

- Schools may look at primary school results to ensure students can benefit from the school's pace of learning.

*Students, be sincere, be genuine, and be yourself – if you are a good fit for the school, it will show.*

## Why Targeted Remediation

- Following a review of current practices, the school will be moving away from supplementary classes for all Primary 6 students towards a targeted remediation approach.
- This approach enables the school to better address students' differentiated learning needs, providing additional support to those who require it.
- Targeted remediation allows for more focused and purposeful intervention, ensuring effective use of instructional time and resources.



## **Consideration for Students' Mental and Emotional Well-Being**

- The school will not be conducting remedial lessons during the March school holidays.
- To safeguard students' mental and emotional well-being, particularly at the early stage of the PSLE year.
- The school is mindful of the need to prevent mental fatigue and undue academic pressure on students.



## Progressive Support Leading Up to PSLE

- Academic support will be implemented progressively as students approach the PSLE examinations.
- Targeted remediation will be carried out during the June and September holidays, when students are better positioned to benefit from focused consolidation.
- This balanced approach ensures that students receive timely and appropriate support, while maintaining their overall well-being.

## Wearing of Smart-watches and devices

Are students prohibited from wearing smartwatches? As many parents are working, these devices facilitate tracking and communication with their children, potentially reducing the reliance on mobile phones.

- Yes, bringing devices such as smartphones/smartwatches is prohibited in our school, as stated on Pg 12 of the student handbook. However, we do understand some of the constraints that parents face.
